I write this on 28/12/40. The triangle
in Gold Bullion lace represents my Sub:

Lieutenant's Spurrier Park Badge in the Australian
Marine Corps under The Australian Defence Act
1903 & section 7 of The Defence Act 1903 of Qld.

The Officer's Uniforms carried partly subject to
the Australian Naval uniforms with this exception that
the Spurrier Coat in R.N was replaced by the Triangle
in the Australian Naval Forces. I also wish to note
a further exception which was that the Gover
Uniform Buttons in addition to the brass plated
the letters H M) surrounding the emblem (Her
Majesty's Australian Navy.) I have endeavoured
rather unsuccessfully to take an impression of
a button from one of my uniforms above.

I write as one of those whose efforts helped to
found the Australian Navy in which as

as result of Federation the Australian Marine Defence Force was absorbed, when the Commonwealth Naval Forces were created by Commonwealth Legislation.

May I interpolate the marks [] on the previous page indicate the size of my shoulder straps on one of my white Dunk uniforms from which I cut the badge above



I append the Uniform Regulations that governed us until the Commonwealth Regulation superseded.

QUEENSLAND MARINE DEFENCE FORCE
GENERAL DRESS REGULATIONS
By Captain WALTON-DUFFEY, Q.M.D.F., Acting
Commandant, Q.D.F.
Head-Quarters, Naval Station,
Brisbane, 1 July, 1898.

PREVIOUS Uniform Regulations for Officers are hereby cancelled.
The following are the descriptions of the Uniforms to be worn by the Officers of the Queensland Defence Force (Marine) :-

Dresses.	Occasions.
No. 1. Full—Frock coat, cocked hat, epaulettes, plain blue trousers, sword, undress belt, white gloves	State occasions, and special ceremonies and entertainments at discretion of Senior Staff Executives Officer.
No. 2. Ball and Mess Dress—Blue jacket, white or blue mess waistcoat, lamp trousers, white gloves	Official and public balls, and special dinner and evening entertainments.
No. 3. Frock Coat—Frock coat, morning waistcoat, plain blue or white trousers, cap, sword, undress belt, white gloves	Ordinary occasions of duty and ceremony on shore or afloat, funerals, courting, martial dances, entertainments, &c., in the daytime.
No. 4. Undress—Undress coat; single-breasted with stand-up collar; evening waistcoat, plain blue or white trousers, cap, sword, undress belt, brown dogskin gloves White Undress—White undress coat, shoulder straps, white trousers, helmet or white cap-cover, sword, undress belt, brown dogskin gloves	Drills and exercises, other occasions of duty ashore and afloat as requisite.
No. 5. Mess Undress—Blue or white jackets, plain blue trousers, evening waistcoat (blue or white) or white cummerbund	As above.
Gaiters will be worn as ordered.	

The gold lace triangle surmounting the upper distinctive stripe on Executive Naval Brigade Officers' Uniform shall enclose an equilateral triangle of blue cloth with sides three-quarter inch, and the buttons on the sleeves of Commissioned Officers' Uniform may be discontinued in future.


