## Bradleys Head Group Tour



From arrival of the First Fleet in 1788 to the present Port Jackson has been home to naval units. Initially ships were detached from the Royal Navy to provide Naval defence until 1859. Then followed the New South Wales Colonial Navy, the Commonwealth Naval Force from Federation and from 1911, the Royal Australian Navy.

**Duration:** 1.5 hours starting at 1030 am.

**Mobility:** The pathways and areas visited during this tour are generally flat and easily accessible. The total distance walked is less than one kilometre.
